

JUDGING: WEDNESDAY AUGUST 18th, AT 11:00 a.m.

- A. Entry Fees: \$12.00 per horse. Stalls and tack rooms are limited, so enter early! Entries will close when stalls are full regardless of actual entry deadline. Care should be taken to enter each horse in its proper section and class. **All entry forms, registration papers and fees must be MAILED IN or DROPPED OFF at the Fair Business Office, 796 West 13th, Eugene OR 97402 by Friday, July 30th at 6:00 p.m.** Registration papers must show ownership for at least 30 days. (Do not send originals). If you have a request to stall with someone, enclose it on a separate sheet with registration papers.
- B. There are **NO online entries for livestock departments. Copies of blank entry forms and department information may be downloaded online or picked up at the Fair Business Office between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.** Opportunities for assistance in filling out your entry forms will be made available at the Fairgrounds on July 30th between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. in the Auditorium. Premiums will be paid out on Saturday, August 21st between 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. **If premiums are not picked up, they will be mailed by check no later than September 30th.**
- C. All horses must be checked in and stalled between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 17th.
- D. Each Exhibitor is responsible for seeing that his or her area is clean and presentable to the public by 10:45 a.m. each day prior to the Fair opening. **If Stalls are not cleaned daily (before Fair opens) Exhibitors will be asked to leave and premiums will be forfeited!! If you have questions, see the Superintendent.**
- E. A limited number of tack stalls will be available at \$12.00 each. They may be indoors, near your stalls. Tack stalls are limited, so please when you enter, "buddy up" with a friend when possible. No wall removal in tack stalls permitted. They are for tack, feed and supplies only!
- F. Priority for stalls in the front of the barn will be given to Exhibitors who decorate their stalls. Let's all use our best decorating imagination to make our barn the best in the Fair! **Decorating will be judged. To compete you must enter Section 20, Class 1.** Any "For Sale" signs must be 8" x 10" or smaller.
- G. **NO** locks on stall doors or covers over portable stalls per Fire Marshal.
- H. Exercising hours for horses in the main arena will be announced by the Superintendent. No loose horses permitted at any time. All horses must be under control.
- I. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to be at the paddock and checked in prior to his or her class.
- J. **Please remember that we are representing the general horse owning population. Any inappropriate language or behavior reflects on all of us and will not be tolerated. Please dress in appropriate attire (no bathing suit tops, no short shorts).**
- K. All entries **will be released Sunday, August 22nd AFTER CLOSE OF FAIR.** See Superintendent for move-out instructions.
- L. **Demonstrations:** Contact Horse Superintendent on Tuesday, August 17th to inquire/register for demonstrating. We welcome new ideas to inform and entertain our visitors and exhibitors.
- M. **NO ONE** under the age of 18 will be allowed to handle a stallion in any class or in the stallion showcase.

Parade Of Stallions*Friday, August 20, 2010 at 6:30 p.m.***Exhibitor Criteria**

1. Please contact Superintendent on Wednesday, August 18th to indicate your participation with your stallion for the Friday night Showcase.
2. Include a contact name and telephone number on each page of all documents submitted.
3. Plan to spend 3 - 6 minutes presenting your stallion.
4. Your entry must include three items:
 - A. A description of your presentation (e.g., under saddle, in-hand, with get, etc.)
 - B. A typewritten script, written on a separate sheet, double-spaced in 12-point font. Read it aloud for flow, grammar and appropriate length. It may be shorter to permit adlib opportunities, but what you write will be the core of the presentation and should include the most important considerations for potential clients.
 - C. Identify the music you will bring. It may be on tape or CD and may include multiple songs (totaling 6 minutes in length), but limit your source to one tape or CD.
5. Consider this: The purpose of this show is to entertain Fair patrons, many who have a love of horses, but little practical knowledge or expertise - so this is your chance to be a good ambassador.

Stallions shown at liberty may exhibit an unappealing preference for the gate at the far end of the arena which does not do you any favors, so be creative in terms of costume, music, or theme. Feel free to call Sharon Matthews, Horse Superintendent, at 746-1854, if you are not sure whether your idea will work. Give the audience a sample of what makes your horse special and a sense for what makes your horse(s) important and enjoyable to you. We'll do our part to encourage visits to the stall/barn where you can take advantage of those important one-on-one contacts.
