LANE COUNTY YOUTH FAIR RULES AND CONDITIONS

Exhibitor Fees: \$25.00 per exhibitor. (Judging on Thursday, August 18, 2011 starting at 9:00 a.m.)

- A. All Exhibitors must read and abide by the General Rules, which are located on our website at "www.atthefair.com".
- B. **There are NO "online" entries for this department. Copies of blank entry forms and pertinent documentation to accompany entries may be downloaded from our website or hard copies may be picked up at the Fair Business Office between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, as of April 1, 2011. All entry forms, and fees must be MAILED IN or DROPPED OFF at the Fair Business Office, 796 West 13th, Eugene, OR 97402, and received by Monday, May 2nd, at 5:00 p.m. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
- C. Entries must be in place by 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 16, 2011. Load-in will be from 1:00 p.m. — 9:00 p.m. in the Livestock Pavilion on the west end of the Fairgrounds.
- D. Exhibitors shall keep their pens, stalls and surrounding areas neat, clean, safe and secure. All dirty bedding is to be disposed of daily at the south end of the horse stalls (area is clearly marked).
- E. All cattle must be double tied!
- F. No grooming chutes will be allowed in the barns. Wash rack areas are located on the north side of the Livestock Pavilion.
- G. Each exhibitor shall furnish the necessary feed for her/his animals and arrange for their proper feeding and care daily. (Sawdust bedding will be provided by Lane County Fair Staff.)
- H. All Youth entries for the Youth Department MUST be entered in a Youth Fair Department Showmanship Class.
- I. All entries will be released on Sunday, August 21, 2011, between 5:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Details for move-out will be posted in the Livestock Pavilion.
- J. No livestock may be removed from the Fairgrounds before specified date and times. If removed early without approval, the exhibitor will forfeit any ribbons or prizes. If early removal is necessary, it MUST be coordinated in advance with the Department Coordinator.
- K. A Clinical Inspection may be made of all animals upon arrival. Animals showing infectious or contagious disease will be refused entry.
- L. No premiums awarded for this Department. Ribbons awarded only.

Goats—(kids, wethers, or does)(red or blue ribbon), and market quality, weighing at minimum of 65 lbs. at Fair 4. MARKET AUCTION RULES

The Lane County Livestock Association has coordinated with the Lane County Fair to provide a learning experience for boys and girls raising meat animals. These are the Auction Committee rules set forth by the Lane County Livestock Association. The 2011 Auction will be held at the Lane County Fair in Eugene, Oregon, on Saturday, August 20, 2011. The auction will begin at 2:00 p.m. with small animals (rabbit and poultry) followed by hogs, goats, lambs and beef.

1. A market livestock exhibitor may sell only ONE large animal, turkey, or pen of three rabbits or chickens.
2. All large market animals sold through the Lane County Livestock Association are encouraged to be registered, weighed, and tagged by March 5, 2011 (Beef weigh-in) and April 23, 2011 (Hogs & Sheep weigh-in).
3. Market animals will be weighed during scheduled scale hours, on August 16, 2011 between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Only one weigh-in allowed, no exceptions. No re-weighs or check weights. Entry weights are as recorded with the scale weights and are subject to a percentage shrink to be determined prior to sale.
4. Animals under minimum weight or over maximum weight are not eligible to sell.
5. All market animal exhibitors will submit a Quality Assurance Certification at Fair weigh-in indicating that all medications were withdrawn within designated time prior to slaughter. Exhibitors are also required to participate in this quality assurance program. Forms will be available at time of weigh-in on August 16th and can be downloaded from the fair website at “www.atthefair.com”.
6. All market animals exhibitors will submit a Country of Origin Labeling (COOL) Form at Fair weigh-in. Forms will be available at time of weigh-in on August 16th and can be downloaded from the fair website at “www.atthefair.com”.
7. Prior to Auction, floor prices will be announced for all animals eligible for sale.
8. A reasonable commission on the gross sale will be withheld for Auction and Fair expenses of each animal.

9. Animals may be sold only once through the sale ring.
10. "Add-on" bids or prices can only be made by the original buyers.
11. ORDER OF SALE: The auction order will be rabbits and poultry, hogs, goats, lambs, beef. Champion and Reserve Champion of each species will sell just prior to that species. All animals selling as champions and reserve champions must grade high choice in the ring. Animals will sell according to their placement in the show ring.
12. If the animal is condemned in the slaughter process because of disease, use of medication (feed or injected), (other than natural causes) it is the seller's (exhibitor's) responsibility to absorb the loss.
13. Any exhibitor has the privilege of withdrawing her/his animal from the sale provided the Lane County Fair Office receives a written notification by 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, August 18, 2011.
14. Animals, which are not in the sale and those not sold, are the responsibility of the owner. The sale committee is not responsible for the sale of off-grade or off-weight animals.
15. Steers sold must be left tied with a good halter of 1/2" rope, which will NOT be returned after slaughter.
16. EAR TAGS MUST REMAIN ON THE ANIMAL AFTER THE AUCTION.
17. Abandoned animals remaining after designated pick-up time of 9:00 a.m. on August 21, 2011, the day after the sale, will be disposed of by the Auction Committee.
18. An exhibitor may not regain ownership (of a market animal) until October 3rd of the current year.
19. All exhibitors selling animals at Auction must personally present their thank-you and picture to the buyer following Auction.
20. Exhibitors can expect to receive sale checks from the Auction Committee via U.S. postal mail after Labor Day.
21. Any violation of these rules may result in loss of privilege of participation in current and/or future sales.
