CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- A. Entries are limited to residents living or owning land in Lane County, Oregon. Management reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered, to limit entries according to space available and to eliminate classes if insufficient entries are received.
- B. Pre-registration is required and will be accepted ONLINE through our Fair website at www.atthefair.com or by mail. Entry deadline is July 31st, at midnight. Changes to any entry can be made on the day entries are actually accepted. Opportunities for assistance in entering entries will be made available at the Fairgrounds on Friday July 30th, between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. in the Auditorium.
- C. Bring your entries to the Auditorium located at the Lane County Fairgrounds on Tuesday, August 17th, between 1:00pm and 8:00 pm
- D. If you are unable to bring your entry on entry day, please make arrangements to have someone bring it for you. We will NOT be accepting early entries prior to entry day.
- E. Lane County Fair employees/and or their representatives are not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items.
- F. Exhibitors are awarded only one (1) monies per class. Premiums will be paid out Saturday, August 21st, between 11:00am and 5:00 p.m. Premiums that are not picked up during Fair will be mailed by check no later than September 30th.
- G. All entries need to be picked up on Monday, August 23rd between Noon and 6:00 p.m. Any entries left after 6:00pm will become the Superintendent's responsibility for disposition.
- H. The Exhibitor must have grown all Exhibits in Sections 920 and 922. All Potted Plants must have been grown by, or in the possession of the Exhibitor 60 days prior to Fair and all plants must have a water saucer.
- I. The Fair will furnish containers for cut flowers.
- J. Exhibitors are asked to **replace cut flowers as often as necessary for the duration of the Fair, at least once**.
- K. Artificial flowers or foliage is excluded.
- L. Exhibitors are not to remove any exhibit before the end of the Fair without permission from the Department Superintendent.
- M. **ABSOLUTELY NO SAND ANYWHERE IN FLORAL DEPARTMENT.**
- N. **Arrangements:** Exhibitors must furnish their own containers labeled on the bottom with owners name. Arranger may place own arrangement. Committee will assist. **Arrangements must be kept fresh until the close of the Fair. Please plan on replacing flower arrangements at least once.** Arrangements not conforming to schedule will be used for display only. Foliage is permitted in all classes unless otherwise specified. Accessories are permitted. Only **one design per class allowed in Design Section.**
- O. All entries in Section 920 should be shown with their own attached leaves. **Please write the name on entry card, if at all possible.**

921 Potted Plants

Not open to commercial growers—gallon size plastic or pottery containers and/or baskets—no hanging baskets or huge tubs, please!

CLASS:

1. Rex Begonias—featuring foliage
2. Martha Washington Geraniums—any color
3. Geraniums-any other types; scented, novelty, ivy etc.
4. African Violet—one crown
5. Cactus and/or succulents, one plant per container
6. Cactus and/or succulents, multiple plants per container
7. Indoor plant, featuring bloom, pot under 6"
8. Indoor plant, featuring bloom, pot over 6"
9. Indoor plant, featuring foliage pot under 6"
10. Indoor plant, featuring foliage, pot over 6"
11. Indoor Ferns, all types, enter in this class only
12. Planters, mix of 3 or more different in suitable container up to 12" max, must have water saver or provisions for watering

922 Junior Section

18 years of age and under

CLASS:

1. Asters, 1 bloom
2. Cosmos, 3 stems
3. Dahlias, over 6", 1 bloom
4. Dahlias, under 6", 1 bloom
5. Marigolds, petite, 3 stems alike
6. Petunia, 3 stems
7. Zinnia, small, 3 blooms alike or assorted
8. Zinnia, large, 1 bloom
9. Cut flower, large, any other, 1 stem
10. Cut flower, small, any other, 3 stems alike
11. Gladiola, 1 spike
12. Sunflowers, 1 bloom, any color

SECTION

923 Garden Clubs - No Premiums Awarded

Designs must be kept fresh by the club until the Fair closes on Sunday. Garden Clubs will sponsor a hands on experience with dish gardens and floral arrangements. Other Demonstrations to be announced.

Entries will be judged as follows:

Conformance.....20 points
Design.....42 points
Distinction.....16 points
Creativity and expression.....22 points

SECTION

924 Open Class

Open to anyone. Judges and professionals must enter this class only.

CLASS:

1. McKenzie Ripples: Featuring water as part of design and using fresh flowers.
2. Blooming Buddies: Use 2 containers and your choice of fresh and/or dried materials.
3. Timberline: Feature weathered wood with fresh flowers and foliage.
4. Out of this World: Designer's choice of flowers, foliage and accessories.
5. Recycling Fun: Use something in your design that you have recycled. Fresh and/or dried materials.
6. Dew Drops: Miniature design, not to exceed 5" in any direction. All dried.

SECTION

925 Advanced Amateur

Open to those who have won more than 5 blue ribbons.

The Exhibitor must make Designs and need not have grown plant materials.

CLASS:

1. Color Me Fall: Mass design of fresh flowers and foliage. Show color harmony.
2. Recycled Beauty: Be creative in using your item with your choice of materials.
3. Going Green: All foliage design, using many shades of greenery, even some herbs.
4. Grandma's Kitchen: Reflecting the 50's. Designer's Choice of accessories and materials.
5. Harvest Moon: Use fruits and/or veggies from your garden; fresh and/or dried materials.
6. Tiny Jewels: Miniature design, not to exceed 5" in any direction.

SECTION

926 Novice

Those who have won 5 or fewer blue ribbons.

The Exhibitor must make Designs and need not have grown plant materials.

CLASS:

1. Grandma's Kitchen: As a bride in the 40's. May use fresh and or dried materials.
2. Garden Salad: All foliage design, may combine herbs with other garden greens. Be creative.
3. Company's Coming: A Table design of your choice using fresh flowers.
4. Ocean Shores: Use something from the Seashore, and use fresh and/or dried materials.
5. Watcha Do with Watcha Got: Designer's choice of accessories, flowers, etc.
6. Tiddly Wink: Miniature design, not to exceed 5" in any direction.

SECTION

927 Juniors

Grades 7 through 12

The Exhibitor must make Designs and need not have grown plant material.

CLASS:

1. This is Duck Country: Use yellow and green colors in design with fresh flowers.
2. This is Beaver Country: Use orange and black colors in design with fresh flowers.
3. Yankee Doodle: Design of your choice. You might use red, white and blue and any accessories you wish.
4. Show and Tell: Decorate a zucchini, around 12" or under and give it a name!



SECTION

928 Juniors

Grades K through 6

The Exhibitor must make Designs and need not have grown plant material.

CLASS:

1. **Beach Fun:** Show a "treasure" you found such as shells, wood, etc. and use in design.
2. **Mary Had a Little Lamb:** Show your lamb with your little basket of flowers from your garden.
3. **Our Tea Party:** Fill your cup with flowers and put on a small tray.
4. **Have fun with Zucs:** Decorate a zucchini 12" or under any way you wish. Give it a name!

929 Table Settings

Tables will be provided. No Silverware, please.

The Exhibitor must make Designs and has choice of all materials used and need not have grown them.

CLASS:

1. **Casual, Informal for 2**— Examples: Patio or tailgate party; Alfresco; children's party, baby shower, etc. Your choice of accessories, flowers, tablecloth, etc.
2. **Semi-Formal for 2**— Examples: Wedding reception; anniversary; engagement parties, graduation, luncheons, etc. Your choice of accessories, tablecloth, flowers, foliage, etc.
3. **Tray Tables**— State if for breakfast, tea, or lunch, etc.
